

5 Types of Collaboration:

1. One Teach/One Assist Teaching - whole group of students and 2 teachers.
 - a. One teacher - teaches lesson
 - b. One teacher - supports (drifts, makes comments to cue lead teacher, ask questions for clarification for the students.

2. Station Teaching - three or more groups of students and 2 teachers.
 - a. Heterogeneous and homogeneous grouping
 - b. Some students will work independently.
 - c. Some students will participate in peer tutoring.
 - d. One teacher will review important information.
 - e. One teacher will move the advanced group forward.

3. Parallel Teaching - two groups of students and 2 teachers.
 - a. Heterogeneous groups
 - b. Teachers plan the instruction jointly but each delivers it to half the class group.

4. Alternative Teaching - two groups of students and 2 teachers.
 - a. Homogeneous grouping
 - b. Teachers may take turns leading a discussion, one may speak while the other demonstrates a concept, one may speak while the other models note taking on the chalkboard and so on.

5. Team teaching - one group of students and 2 teachers.
 - a. Coordinated activities in one lesson
 - b. Teachers share instruction (one at a time)
 - c. Mutual trust and commitment
 - d. Co-planning.
